9. Flag Star Bank Third Party Agreement

WHEREAS, all public deposits of funds in excess of the amount insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Act are required to be secured in accordance with General Municipal Law §10 and depository banks are required to provide collateral for such deposits, and

WHEREAS, all securities and collateral pledged to secure deposits must be held pursuant to a written security and custodial agreement, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees finds that it is in the Village's best interest to require that such collateral be delivered to a bank or trust company other than the financial institution in which the deposits are made so as to protect the Village's collateral from claims of creditors if the depository bank becomes insolvent,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board:

- 1. Designates Flagstar Bank, N.A., having offices at 102 Duffy Avenue, Hicksville, New York 11801 ("Flagstar") as a depository for the deposit of monies up to a maximum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000); and
- 2. Authorizes and designates Federal Home Loan Bank of New York ("FHLB") to serve as a custodian for securities pledged by Flagstar in accordance with a third-party custodian agreement; and
- 3. Agrees to enter into a Third Party Custodian Agreement amongst the Village, Flagstar (as a depository bank) and FHLB to provide for FHLB to serve as the custodian of securities pledged by Flagstar for the benefit of the Village, and authorizes the Mayor to execute such agreement upon approval as to the form of agreement by the Village Attorney.
