3. <u>Notice of Meeting–Nassau Herald:</u>

4. <u>Minutes – March 5, 2019 meeting minutes</u>

On motion by Mayor Epstein seconded by_Trustee Schnell, the Board voted unanimously (with Trustee Levine not yet present) to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the March 5, 2019 Board as the Clerk has previously mailed such minutes to the Board and they are hereby approved.

7. <u>Adoption of Budget:</u>

8. <u>Setting the Rate:</u>

Mayor Epstein offered the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Village previously elected to cease being an assessing unit, and the Assessment Roll for the year 2019 was prepared and filed by Nassau County Assessors,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the rate of 85.250 for Class 1 properties, 2.340 for Class 3 properties and 11.213 for Class 4 properties be affixed to apply to each \$100.00 of assessed valuation as appearing on said roll for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 2019 and ending May 31, 2020 and the Clerk is authorized and directed to extend and carry out the Roll, the amount to be collected from each person therein.

The above resolution was seconded by Trustee Schnell and unanimously approved.

9. Delivering the Roll:

On motion by Mayor Epstein, seconded by Trustee Schnell, and unanimously approved, the Clerk was instructed to deliver to the Treasurer on or before May 20, 2019 the Assessment Roll with a warrant attached thereto signed by the Mayor, attested to by the Clerk under the Corporate seal of the Village, containing a summary statement of the purposes and total amount for all purposes and commanding the Clerk to collect the taxes therein.

10. <u>Mailing Tax Bills:</u>

On motion by Mayor Epstein, seconded by Trustee Schnell, and unanimously approved, the Clerk was instructed to mail tax bills to all persons and corporations whose names appear on the assessment roll subsequent to May 25, 2019.

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11. <u>Publications and Posting:</u>

On motion by Mayor Epstein, seconded by Trustee Schnell, and unanimously approved, the following instructions were issued to the Clerk:

"Subsequent to May 8, 2019 and on or before June 1, 2019, the Clerk shall cause notice to be published in the official newspaper of the Village (Nassau Herald) and posted in five conspicuous places in the Village that the tax roll and warrant have been left with her for collection of taxes from June 1, 2019 to July 1, 2019, inclusive from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. daily except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays containing such other matters as set forth in Section 1428 of the New York Real Property Tax Law. This notice must be published again one week after the first publication.

12. <u>Tax Warrant:</u>

On motion by Mayor Epstein seconded by Trustee Schnell and unanimously approved, the Mayor is to execute the warrant.

13. <u>Proposals for Annual Storm Water Report:</u>

West Side Engineering, PC\$1600.00Nelson & Pope Engineers\$2800.00
